we come to the end of another calendar year, this is a good time for customers to review certain aspects of their financial lives to ensure that accounts and coverages are current.

Review your insurance coverages. Make sure updates/changes have been made to address any structural changes to your home, additions or deletions of insurable items such as cars, utility vehicles, etc to make sure all are up-todate for the upcoming year. If any major life or financial events occurred in 2020, such as a birth, death, marriage or divorce, be sure to review beneficiary designations and coverage levels.

Review beneficiary designations and account signatory authorities. Review beneficiaries on your deposit, investment, and insurance accounts to make sure your estate plans are in order. Review power of attorney designations, if in place already, or consider naming

> a trusted individual to this capacity or an authorized signer to bank

accounts in the event you are unable to sign for yourself.

Closely monitor vour credit. You are allowed to receive one free credit report annually from each of the three major credit bureaus at www.AnnualCreditReport.com

Review the reports to determine whether all information is correct and work on any past due or collection debt to improve credit scores.

Assess your savings goals. Review how funds have been spent during the past year to ensure all spending habits are within your budget. Set up an automatic transfer of funds to a savings account or individual retirement account (if eligible) to prepare for the long-term. Review retirement accounts to ensure that your investment allocations meet your retirement goals.

### Partnership With FHLB Results In COVID-19 Aid

Through our partnership with the Federal Home Loan Bank (FHLB) of Chicago, we have had the opportunity in 2020 to apply for and receive COVID-19 grant funding to support our community.

In April of this year, we received a grant under their COVID-19 Relief Program in the amount of \$20,000 which we awarded to the Schuyler County United Way for redistribution to their local grant recipients.

In November, we were able to participate in their Targeted Impact Fund grant through which we received funding of \$15,000. We awarded three \$5,000 grants to each of the following local organizations: Schuyler County Food Basket, the HELP Center, and the Rushville Fitness and Community Center. The Targeted Impact Fund was created by the FHLB to provide funding for social service providers and community centers that support elderly and rural populations and were hardest hit by COVID-19.

We are proud to be able to provide significant, needed funding to organizations within our community. Thank you to the Federal Home Loan Bank for providing these grant opportunities.

## 5 Tips For Safe Online Holiday Shopping

- **1. Shop where you trust.** Make your purchases from legitimate websites and retailer dedicated apps. Do not shop from random or unsolicited emails.
- **2. Use secure, unique passwords** for email accounts, shopping websites and apps. Change passwords often and use complex passwords to avoid account takeover.
- 3. Use a single card for all online purchases to minimize risks to only one account. Consider using a prepaid card with enough to complete your planned purchases.
- 4. Beware of phishing ads and deals that look too good to be true. Clicking or responding to these may allow malware or viruses to be installed on your device
- 5. Review your account information regularly. Watch for and report any suspicious activity. Keep a record of your transactions and compare it to your account activity.
